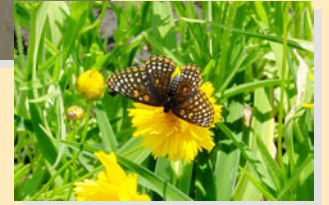


Woodland Hills

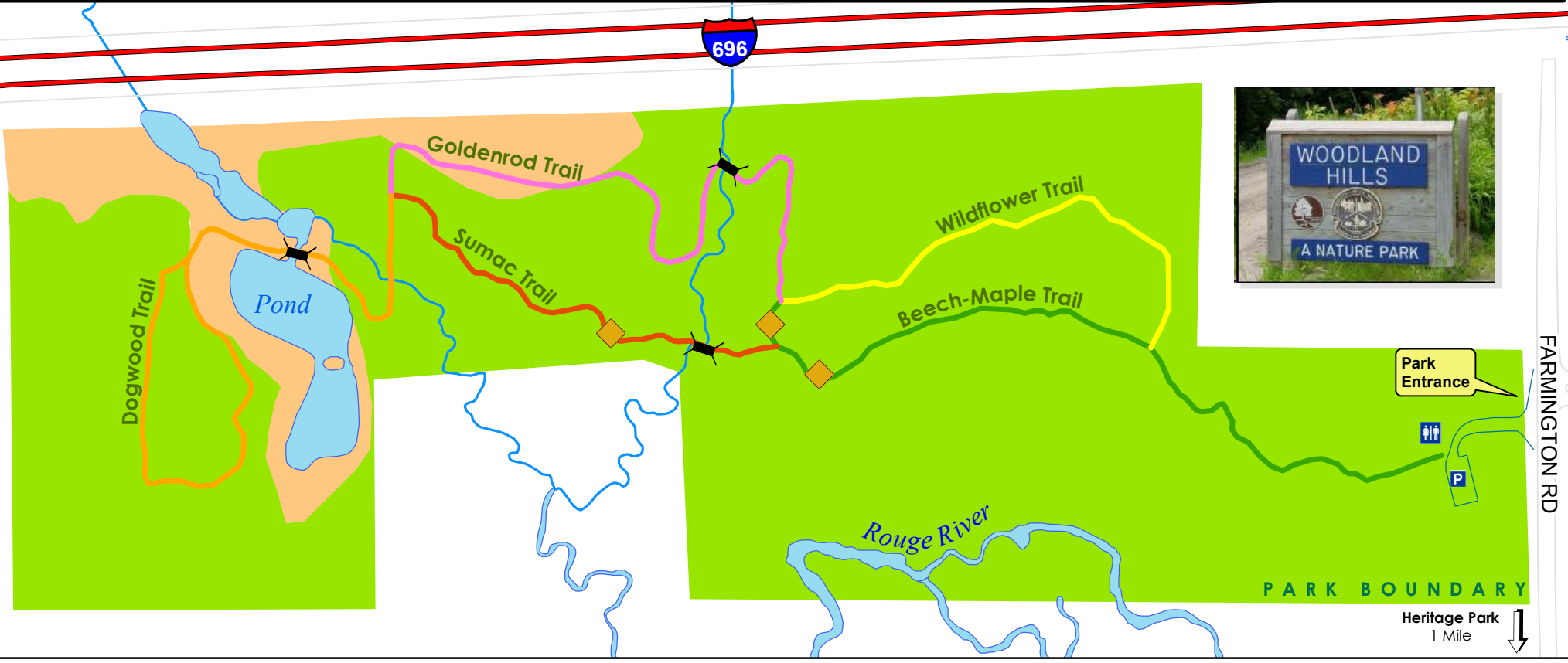
