**FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. (May 30, 2025)** — Continuing a longstanding tradition, the Farmington Hills Beautification Commission invites the community to participate in its annual Beautification Awards program. Nominations are now being accepted for property owners who go above and beyond to create and maintain beautiful landscapes that enhance the beauty of the City of Farmington Hills. **Nominations are open June 2 through 24, with judging taking place in early July 2025.**

Awards are presented annually to businesses, offices, places of worship, shopping centers, and subdivisions and condominiums with attractive and well-maintained landscapes. Judges from the Beautification Commission will visit nominated sites in early July to look for well-planned design, landscape variety, imaginative use of color, originality and property maintenance.
