3. Chief Piggott opened the meeting reiterating his vision of the CPAC group moving forward.

- a. Chief went around the room to see if any members had any open questions or concerns since the last meeting.
 - i. J. Ellis: wondered what occurred in his neighborhood a couple of weeks prior.
 - ii. TR Carr: Commented on HOA meetings in his neighborhood, "excellent speakers" and highly praised Officer Kean who attended the latest meeting.
 - iii. Dr. Bryan: Wondered how the PD cooperated with ICE enforcement in FH?
- b. Chief touched on questions from prior meeting:
 - i. Fireworks – stated we would post firework information on our social media outlets, IG and City's FB page.
 - ii. School Board Meetings – FPS has the jurisdiction for these.
 - iii. Safety at Schools - PO presence is important on shifts, cars parked there, program of school safety checks (900 last year), CLEMIS code for school checks
 - iv. Houses of Worship – patrolled every day, every shift, officers/cars visible, etc.

- v. Speeding on 12/Drake area – special attention log, motor cop and Motor Carrier enforcement big in this area (Ofc. West)
- vi. Solicitation – call 911 OR non-emergency # to report
- vii. Community Engagement – would like to strengthen PD social media presence independent of the City's FB page to increase visibility of police topics.
- viii. Officer Wellness / Peer Support – utilized after the house fire, checked by FD, hospital, etc.
 - 1. Am. Red Cross provides free smoke detectors and CO alarms.
 - 2. AC explained that peer support is also offered to families of officers now as well, they're building this program out.
- ix. Handicap Enforcement – accreditation won't allow for volunteers under that scaled back "background" process; requirements make them more like full time employees. Went away around COVID and that was also the time of accreditation.
- x. Pal Program/Police Explorers? (Mr. Cotton)
 - 1. Community outreach meeting with FAAPN re: SLO program and having more youth exposure.
 - 2. Citizens Police Academy to be created for kids 12-18 range
 - 3. Possibly linking up with a high school to establish CJ as a "club" activity (Mr. Khan).

4. Meeting Conclusion: Chief Piggott concluded the meeting at 1:10pm, encouraging members to think about whether they would be willing to answer questions submitted via the City website about their group they represent in the community (i.e. faith, business, neighborhoods, etc.).
